Lynne said the tagging of the books is going well in preparation for the move. The IRF2 quote for the movers was sent out June 30 for the moving of the books on Sept. 8th.

The soft opening for the library will hopefully be the end of Sept. with the official opening in October during Library Week.

The keys from Van Horne ???? will be handed over the end of July but they will be available through August for the installation of the RFID system and staff training.

The old library building will be used for municipal employees. The furniture will be sold and what is left will be sold on Government Deals and the monies going to the debt.

The staff is working extremely hard packing and organizing for the move. The curb sided pick up is averaging 100 books per day.
