5.3 Concert Series	Paul reported that JD Moffat is confirmed to open the first concert. The Meaford Culture Foundation has approached FOML and offered \$2,500. A discussion took place whether to accept, and if so, what it should be spent on. Paul suggested a sound system. Lighting – Leslie will talk to Rod Willis regarding changing the timer on the lighting system so that the lights stay on longer, to avoid the issue that arose last year with the lights off and people having difficulty making their way out of the harbour pavilion.	Leslie will talk to Rod Willis regarding the timing of the lights at the harbour pavilion during the Sunday Night concerts.
5.4 Net Shed	 Chris reported that Karen and Mary-Louise have been doing lots of sorting of the books. Older books from 2020 (with a red dot) have been pulled. Norm has been very helpful – note that the stairs leading upstairs are not to be used, as they are not safe. The Square payment method is in place, 2.65% for credit card purchases, 10¢ per debit. The Hospital Foundation has requested borrowing the Square for its Plant Sale on June 10. A discussion took place regarding possible exposure to the FOML account if lent out, and how to identify the use. It must be a line item if other users request it, and how often might that occur. Jim will investigate and will report back re: the decision as to 	

	whether FOML allows this or not. A question arose of whether FOML can issue tax receipts for charitable donations of books – it was determined that this could only be done if the books were independently appraised.
